Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens. A time to plant, and a time to uproot the plant. A time to mourn, and a time to dance. A time to embrace, and a time to be far from embraces. A time to rend, and a time to sew.

Dear Parishioners:

I have been reflecting a lot on time lately. After a month as pastor of St. Edwards, many of the questions have been about time. When will things get back to normal? When can we begin activities and small groups? When will be able to attend Mass without facemasks? When will be able to come back and celebrate as a community?

These are all important and good questions and they point at our desire to be able to support ourselves as a community again. The scripture above, from Ecclesiastes, lets me know that we are living in God's time and not our own. It also shows me that there are times for all things, the good and the bad. We have been in a time of mourning – mourning the death of Fr. James West a beloved pastor, mourning the suspension of the public celebration of the Mass, mourning the loss of loved ones. It is hard to imagine that there will be a time of joy and dancing in the future. However, I have faith that slowly and surely we are headed that way. The Lord is faithful and he will provide!

During this time, I want to let you know about a few things happening in the parish and where we are with re-opening our communal life at St. Edward.

Sacraments

Weekend Mass:

On the weekend of May 16th we returned to public Mass with restrictions and an adjusted Sunday Schedule. All who attend must wear facemasks and if you are feeling sick we ask that you refrain from attending, especially since the Bishop has given the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Adoration:

The adoration chapel is still closed at this time. Eucharistic Adoration is the most important devotion we have as Catholics and it unites us to the Source and Summit of our faith the Eucharist. Adoration helps us enter into the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with purer minds and hearts. In June, we opened the church up for prayer before the Eucharist in the tabernacle 9:30-12:30pm (Monday-Thursday) and this will continue but we will also begin to add hours of adoration before the monstrance in July. If you are interested in having an hour to adore from 9:30-12:30 please let the office know and we will begin to make a schedule of more adoration times for August.

Groups/Religious Education

Groups and Religious Education have been suspended since March. For Religious Education, books were sent home to finish the year and are being returned. Large group and small groups will remain cancelled until further notice. I know that these groups are vital for personal spiritual growth and are important for our parish but we will not be able to meet until the Bishop gives approval. Let us unite in prayer and through virtual means so that we can return in joy in the future.

Outreach

Our Parish Outreach Program began serving lunches at the beginning of June. Financial aid for those in need has also begun but in a limited way until restrictions are lifted due to COVID-19. I have been told that there is a collection the first Sunday of each month for Outreach. I am very grateful for this community's generosity of time and money. This is an important ministry and I know St. Edward's has helped it grow in many ways in the past many years. If you have not returned to public Mass yet but want to provide for Outreach then you can send or drop off a donation at the office during the week.

Finances

This is a difficult time. COVID-19 has impacted how we celebrate and live out our faith. It has also made an impact economically on so many people. First, I want to thank everyone for their previous generosity. The generosity of this parish has made so many ministries and renovations possible. The recent renovations to the Church and many projects that were involved in that required the community to come together with their treasure and talents. As I have talked to the diocese, they have been impressed with the success on your restoration efforts. All of that to say, your generosity is much appreciated and it is a blessing to the future of St. Edward's parish. There are many who have been impacted financially during this time. Either hours of work have been limited or positions have been furloughed. If this is something you have gone through personally please know of our prayers for you. I know that the Lord is close to those who suffer so unite to Him and, if you need to, please make a meeting with me so that we can talk about how this experience has impacted your spiritual life.

On a parish level, we have made changes to our budget that reflect the predictions of the impact that COVID-19 may have on our finances. The end-of-the-year report and next year's budget will be sent out in July. I want to reiterate my thankfulness for your generosity. If you are not in a position to give as you have in the past we ask for your prayers because we know they are effective.
